





Out of the Vaults showcases films ripe for rediscovery. Thanks to the Hong Kong Film Archive, we are thrilled to highlight two San Francisco productions by the legendary Chinese American producer Joseph Sunn Jue and his Grandview Film Company.

Joseph Sunn Jue (1904 – 1990) formed the Grandview Film Company in San Francisco in 1933 specializing in comedy, melodrama and romance for the Cantonese-speaking market. By 1939, Jue had re-established Grandview Films in Hong Kong. With the threat of imminent occupation of Southern China by Japan, he returned to San Francisco to continue making films for the duration of World War II. Featuring Cantonese opera actors living in San Francisco at the time, the Grandview films — many shot in color on 16mm — showcase a unique era in diasporic cinema. Seven of these Grandview U.S. productions survived and CAAM is excited to present, for the first time in 67 years, two of these films (BLACK MARKET COUPLE and WHITE POWDER NEON LIGHTS) now with English subtitles.
